**Residential burglaries are on the rise in
YOUR neighborhood... We need your help!**

HERE'S WHAT TO LOOK FOR:

- Criminals are knocking on doors to see if anyone is home. When there is no answer, the criminal walks to the back of the residence and breaks in.
- Unexpected visitors knocking on your door.
- If you do answer your door, suspicious stories of why they are at your door (i.e. they are looking for someone who does not live there).
- Multiple persons-Some may even be female or high school age. Other suspects may be waiting outside or in vehicles talking on cell phones.
- Most residential burglaries occur during the day (weekdays).

WHAT WE NEED YOU TO DO:

- Time is a factor, *immediately* call the Torrance Police Department if you see something you consider suspicious at 310-328-3456 or 911.
- If you are home during the day, be aware of who is approaching your neighbor's residence or knocking on your door. Let the person know someone is home without opening the door.
- Take note of suspect descriptions such as gender, race, clothing, height, weight, age, hair color, eye color, tattoos, etc.
- If possible, take note of vehicle descriptions, license plates, and direction of travel.
